Junior School Barnet Review

Recently the Junior school went through a day-long review by a Barnet panel comprised of a school inspector and several headteachers. This review was requested by the Junior school and is very beneficial to a school with a new headteacher. We are delighted to say that the review went very well, and the governors would like to thank the staff and children of the Junior School for all their hard work leading up to and throughout the day. The review largely concurred with the school's own Self Evaluation process and the output from the review will form part of the Junior School Development Plan (see below).

The school was particularly commended for its excellent mentoring programme. Both schools have a strong and successful record of using experienced teachers to mentor new staff as well as subject leaders carrying out regular internal training and knowledge sessions on a variety of topics.

School Budgets

The Governors have approved the 2015-16 budgets for both schools. Thanks to both Headteachers, the Finance committee and especially Chair of Finance Katie Atwood for all their hard work on this huge undertaking. As you may already know, the London Borough of Barnet no longer gives Brookland Schools any funding for the upkeep of our swimming pool. We are very lucky to have a swimming pool on site – it is part of the National Curriculum and many other schools have to travel, at considerable expense, to allow their students to fulfil this criteria. Unless we make up for this shortfall in parent contributions we cannot guarantee the future of the pool. School Improvements

Both schools are continually working to improve our schools and the school site.

The Infants are continuing to update their ICT provision with the help of donations from our fantastic PA. Money raised at the recent Spring Event and auction will go towards new interactive white boards (IWBs) and updating playground equipment. The Juniors are working on their playground improvement project with funds raised from the PA Winter Fair and the money won in a poster designing competition by Adam Elkafass in year 5. The Juniors have also started to repair the hut ramps, funded by a government grant. Thank you for your patience while these essential works are carried out.

Approval of Residential Trips

The Governing Body is required to approve all residential school trips. At our full governing body meeting on 18th March we approved the educational residential visits to Moat Mount for the year 2 pupils and to Whitby for the year 6 pupils.
