## MMR Vaccinations

## For Information from NHS

Cases of measles are rising in England and there is a risk of outbreaks in London. Protect your children against measles and prevent disruption to school attendance.
Measles is a viral illness that can be serious and sometimes fatal. Cases of measles are rising in London, and with around $75 \%$ of 5-year-olds fully vaccinated in Barnet, we are well below the World Health Organisations target of 95\% needed to prevent an outbreak.
Symptoms of measles include high fever, runny nose, cough, red and watery eyes, small red spots with a bluishwhite centre inside the mouth. A rash can appear later, usually on the face, upper neck, hands and feet, fading after 5 to 6 days.
Vaccination can help prevent outbreaks and protect against serious illness. Read more about the importance of ensuring your child is up to date with their childhood vaccinations here.
Check your child's red book and contact their GP to make sure they are up to date on their routine vaccinations. If your child has missed the vaccine as a baby or pre-schooler, contact your child's GP to make an appointment or visit a catch up clinic:
