I also want to offer some reassurance and highlight that there will be an increased police presence in our communities across Barnet, Brent and Harrow, as well as other areas in London to reassure and protect all of our communities, but particularly those that have been affected by the situation'.

Our Thursday assemblies also focused on the theme for Black History Month this year - 'Saluting the Sisters'- and highlighted the role black women have played in shaping history, inspiring change and building communities in the UK. We will continue to explore this theme next week in class and through our assemblies.
