## This Week:

In Assembly this week, we focused on our Brookland Value of Honesty, we shared our ideas about learning in groups from last term's Whole School Meeting and we learnt about charities who provide warm spaces to people in need. All year groups were fabulous in their First Aid Workshops and we now have 360 certificated first aiders on site! The trainer thoroughly enjoyed working with our school and was impressed by the children's listening and focus as well as how well year 5 and 6 had remembered their learning from 2 years ago. Learning first aid is such an empowering life skill- please do ask the children to share their new skills with you (and if you have not yet had a moment to pay your contribution for the cost of the workshop, please can you do so).



"On Monday 15<sup>th</sup> January, Year 6 was learning about First Aid in the hall with a man called Martin. In the workshop, we did many activities such as CPR & leaning how an epi-pen works. To do CPR, you have to do 30 pushes on the unconscious person's chest and then blow in their mouth twice and repeat until you hear them breathe. An epi-pen is for allergies. It's used when a person eats something that they're allergic to. To use it, you must open a cap where the needle is then you must put the needle in your thigh for almost 10 seconds. If you're feeling weird still you call the ambulance. There is instructions on the epi-pen on how to properly use it."
